ST ANDREW'S CHURCH

Hi Everyone,

Easter is fast approaching and, with it, Spring is also in the air. The longer days, the new life, the promise of Summer ahead is always a very welcome reality.

For Christians the effects of the historic events that we remember and celebrate at Easter are just as real, and just as welcome as they breathe new life into our lives.

There is very good evidence that Jesus was a real man who taught the ordinary people, had a huge following and was crucified. He is mentioned as such by various Roman historians who also report that his followers claimed that he had risen from the dead. No serious scholar would suggest that Jesus was not a real historical figure who lived and died under Roman rule.

Did he really rise from the dead? If he did not then the whole of Christianity is based on a lie and I for one would not want to have anything more to do with it. I became a Christian because I became convinced that it was true and if it was true then it was the most important thing that has ever happened, and it called for a complete change of thinking and lifestyle.

I looked into the evidence for the resurrection and found it compelling.

Everyone agreed that the tomb where Jesus' body had been laid was empty on the following morning. If Jesus had not risen from the dead what could have happened?

Some say that he had not died. Yet it was Roman soldiers who crucified him, it would have been more than their life was worth to make a mistake. They pierced his body to make sure that he was dead and the water and the blood that flowed from his side shows that he had died. The blood begins to separate in the body after someone has died and John carefully records that fact for us.

Some said that the disciples stole the body. Yet they were devastated that Jesus had been

arrested and put to death. They were in despair and had already begun to return to their old lives. Something happened that convinced them to go out and spread the good news, even though many hundreds were martyred as a result.

Maybe the authorities stole the body. But if they had, they would have produced it as evidence to refute Jesus' disciples claims. Neither the Jewish or Roman authorities wanted the upheaval that this new religion was soon to bring.

Maybe robbers stole the body, but what possible motive could they have had, and how would they have overcome the guards? The Roman authorities specifically set guards so that no one would steal the body and start a rumour of resurrection. (see Matt 27v62-66)

No, Jesus died and his body was placed in a stone tomb, a huge stone was placed over the entrance to secure it and a guard was posted. Yet on the morning of the third day the stone was rolled away and the body was gone.

The disciples still did not believe, but over the following few weeks they were convinced. They were convinced by appearances of the risen Jesus, they were so convinced that their lives were turned around, and the whole course of history was changed.



Still time to repair impoverished lawns this month, a light mowing followed by scarifying and then aerate to improve drainage. Overseed any bad areas and rake in well, apply a spring fertiliser and level any bumps or hollows.

Complete pruning of roses as soon as possible and apply fertiliser at approximately a handful to the square yard, but leave a six inch circle around the actual plant itself, and hoe into the surface. After a good downpour mulch around the plants with a one inch layer of manure or bark chippings to hold moisture.

Divide any large clumps of herbaceous plants are unsightly and replant the outer that strongest shoots discarding the middle weaker ones. Dahlias started in boxes can be divided with a sharp knife, making sure that cutting has a bud or shoot on it. Carry on planting gladioli for a succession of flowers.

Carnations and pinks will benefit from an application of fertiliser to established plants, border plants should be planted by the middle of the month, tall growing varieties can be staked with twiggy sticks pushed into the soil so that the stems can grow up through them. Sweet peas sown in the spring can be planted out as soon as they are growing strongly. Many border annuals can be sown directly into the soil this month to provide a good display of colour and help to suppress weeds.

plants can be planted in a cool greenhouse now and sow seeds indoors for outdoor tomatoes to plant out when danger of We have just finished the Road Safety Badge, frosts has passed.

Plant onion sets in shallow drills and just cover the tops to stop birds pulling them out. Salad crops can be sown as soon as the soil is dry enough to work into a fine tilth but sow little and often, every 2-3 weeks so that you get a continuous supply of crops such as lettuce, radish, spring onion and beetroot and harvest as soon as they are large enough to eat, don't wait to get large woody ones.

Carrots can be planted this month, main crop can be sown the middle of next month, sow seeds of late summer cauliflowers and wrinkled seeded varieties of peas which will be ready for picking in approximately 12 weeks. Sow winter cabbages for planting out in June and set out summer cabbages sown last month.

As early potatoes start to shoot from the middle of the month protect the leaves from frost either by drawing the soil over them or cover them with straw or newspaper. Check rhubarb and remove any seed heads as soon as they appear, cut them off as near to the base as possible, if left the plant will stop producing edible sticks, they will become dry and woody very quickly.

Sow melons and cucumbers in a propagator, prick out as soon as they are large enough to handle. Keep an eye on fruit trees and bushes as they start to blossom and take action against pests and diseases.

That's all for now.

Community Projects Group

The CPG meets monthly at the Social Club in New Street, Slip End. These meetings are attended by a good number of residents who are interested in the way our community is developing.

Last year's survey, conducted throughout the Parish, resulted in much feedback which aimed at addressing many issues, specific to us in our community here and now. The "Parish Plan" was drawn up which is being used to guide the CPG in implementing what we want to see done. Much is achievable in the short term, but "heavier" items will take longer!

Parish News

This issue of Parish News is very significant, being the first issue to be distributed free to every dwelling in the Parish.

Many existing readers will be aware that the magazine reflects news, views and information about much of what is happening in the parish. PN ticks many boxes relating to As such. publicity and information in the Parish Plan, so ways were found to provide it at no direct cost to all of our local residents. Costs are met by direct grants from the Parish Council and CPG and by advertising income, roughly a three way split.

The team which faithfully produced PN every month over many years, was also keen to see a full colour product. This was costed and, although more expensive than previous printing methods, came within budget. Two full colour issues preceded this one which were extremely well received by about the 50% of the community who read it.

Today, 100% of the community will have access to PN, thus achieving to a significant extent, the substance of the Parish Plan. Get along to the next (I mentioned that this step was 'easily meeting at the Social achievable', but it should be recognised that Club on April 10th at the small PN team has worked its socks off 7.30: vou're welcome! over the last 6 months or so!)

What next?

Other aspects of the Parish Plan are a bit more difficult to achieve! At last month's meeting, for example, we heard from Steve Fuell about the joys of bringing traffic calming and lower speeds to the parish. Steve has been using his persistent talent to "get things done". He has been faced with many barriers against our objectives, such as reducing budgets, the climate of ever changing regulations, "elf'n'safety". data protection. political correctness, etc. etc. (not to mention "some" bureaucratic inefficiency which has existed and still does within some levels of government!)

In that context, it may be understandable to some extent that little appears to have been achieved, but sad none the less.

However. Steve continues undeterred. His latest pursuit, from within his remit as a Parish Councillor, follows a jumble of schemes aimed at scourging speeding motorists. We wish him well!

Who cares?

The increasing numbers at CPG meetings suggests that many do care and are not resigned to take the "easy approach" by just putting up with what is imposed on us. (A cynical view might suggest that those people head the list of whingers, surely not true in our parish?)

At the last meeting there were some new faces, people who have interests in local groups, young and not-so-young and it was great to welcome them. Still more are wanted, both individuals and others representing more of those groups and organisations. Our meetings, conducted efficiently by Sarah Minnighan are only a bit formal but everyone gets a say!

Parish Council Notes

Community Payback

Work has now been completed throughout the Parish, the team cutting back the overhangs, grass on the verges and cutting back the vegetation to restore the footpaths to their full width. These are people, you will recall, who are non residents and are giving back to society some constructive use of their time and effort.

Our thanks go to them for the hard work they have put in and many have expressed appreciation for the work they have done in tidying up the place. Even I was surprised at the volume of litter and cans they collected, not all of which I suspect was dropped by passing motorists! The scheme has been so successful, it is hoped the work may be performed every six months in future.

Bus Shelters

Contrary to a rumour circulating round the Parish the bus shelters were not damaged by an earthquake. One had been destroyed by a car and the other suffered damage to its roof. At the time of going to press plans had been made for the repair work to be completed and hopefully that has now been completed.

Superfast Broadband

It appears BT have installed a green box out side the Village Hall to accommodate the wiring for the new fast broadband system. My concern is that there should be other similar boxes popping up by the side of the existing smaller green boxes. Maybe I am being a bit premature and we are still a year or so away from us having a similar service to parts of Caddington.

Gas Works In Woodside

In the summer there is going to be major gas work in Manor Road from Caddington to Woodside Road. A meeting with the Gas Company, Steve Fuell, Andy Prothero (resident of Woodside) and myself is planned. Look out for more details in next month's Parish News.

Street Watch & Speed Watch

PCSO's Mapp and Clark attended the February Parish Council meeting to explain these two schemes. These rely on volunteers to come forward. In the case of Street Watch, pairs of residents would stroll around areas in the Parish at a time of their choosing to observe what is going on and report matters of concern. Similar really, to what we all do now but with the added advantage the patrols are highly visible. This scheme has provided a high deterrent effect in other areas locally.

Similarly, with Speed Watch, two residents would use a piece of kit to determine the speed of passing motorists. Those found to be speeding would be reported to the Police, who in turn would write to or visit offenders. For persistent offenders the Police would be asked to visit with their radar equipment, at the appropriate time to catch the individual. The other option is that we will have access to our 'rent-a-cop' scheme to catch regular offenders.

Street Watch & Speed Watch will be organised through the Community Projects Group if you are interested in volunteering for this please get in touch with either myself or Sarah Minnighan, the Chair of the Projects Group.

Planning Application Newlands Road

You may have seen in last months PN that a planning application had been submitted to Luton Borough Council for a development of 230 units in Newlands Road.

The Parish Council submitted an objection to Luton on the following grounds: adverse effects of additional traffic on Newlands Road particularly at its 3 junctions, impact on the Village School as there is no capacity in the nearby Luton Schools, excessive density of housing of which there is none classed as affordable, no section 106 funds to enhance existing or provide new community facilities. Proposal falls outside existing LBC planning policies. A planning decision has not yet been made, however, I shall let you know the outcome.

Public Meeting: Airport Expansion Ideas

Since Luton Airport did not feel that the first Parish outside the Borough on the Westerly Departure route was important enough to come and tell us about their thoughts, we decided to tell you ourselves.

Not wishing to pre-judge the outcome of the meeting, I have a strong feeling residents are very concerned. Mention will have been made at the meeting of the CASE4 group, which was formed several years ago jointly with Caddington.

STOP PRESS

The original consultation which gave rise to the Public Meeting was undertaken by consultants acting on behalf of the owners of the Airport Luton Borough Council.

I received details today of what appears to be a separate and different proposal from the Company which operates Luton Airport. The headline difference appears to be that the owners wish to increase passenger numbers to 18 million whereas the operators are looking at 15 million.

If you missed the Public Meeting, the Airport Operator is holding a six week consultation on their Master Plan., which will run to 25 April. See www.london-luton.co.uk/masterplan/

Consultation on the owners' (LBC) proposal ended on 26th Marc. However, if you haven't done so already, it may still be worth commenting. Their web site is www.futureluton.co.uk/optimisation If that has

closed hold your comments as there will be plenty of opportunities to make them, if and when the owner submits a planning application.

Earthquake strikes Slip End...

Slip End is a normally tranquil village in rural South Bedfordshire but the peace was shattered by significant seismic activity last month. Registering 5.7 on the Richter Scale, the 'quake epicentre was close to the 'community hub'; the crossroads in the centre of the Village. Considerable structural damage was caused to two single story buildings, used by villagers mainly as bus shelters.

This information came in a written statement by a spokesperson for the 'Asset Holders'. "In restoring these buildings for use by the Villagers of Slip End and District, the EC statutory regulations relating to proofing public buildings against structural damage caused by earthquake must be taken into consideration. As such, substantial costs will be sought from grant assistance and other sources. It is our intention that repairs will be in place by noon on April 1st."
