### PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 7th June in the Village Hall.

One Planning Application was discussed this month:

CB/21/02230/FULL - 5, Front Street, Slip End - Demolition of log cabin, and conversion of existing dwelling into 2, two-bedroom dwellings.

After a short discussion, it was agreed to offer no comment to this Planning Application.

The 2020/ 2021 Parish Council Accounts were approved and will be available shortly for download from the Parish Council Website. Six 2020/2021 Budget items were overspent, but overall we ended the Year under budget.

The Parish Council successfully passed its internal audit. Public Rights dates are the times when members of the Public can inspect the Parish Council Accounts. The dates this year are the 15th June to 27th July. Details will be posted on Parish Council website and notice boards.

Graffiti on a piece of Playground equipment will be removed.

Hopefully Residents will have noticed that the hanging flower baskets



throughout the Parish have been installed again this year. Damaged baskets will be replaced.

The Parish Council is aware of overgrown grass on some verges throughout the Parish. These verges are the ones that CBC are responsible for trimming. Parish Councillors were asked to identify to the Parish Clerk the worst affected areas and he will then send a consolidated report to CBC Highways.

The proposed gate and signage being installed by CBC in Woodside Road are still on-going, as a new supplier has had to be found. There is also an issue with its siting on the verge.

The damaged gate in Grove Road will be reported through the CBC Portal.

Fly-tipping continues to be an issue. The CBC funded grab lorry now visits the Parish regularly to remove waste. The Parish Council has not received any new information from CBC about the installation of covert cameras at the worst hot-spots.

The Slip End Good Neighbour Scheme currently plans to hold a socially distanced Tea Party in the Village Hall on the 15th September. More details will be made available nearer the time and will be subject to any current Government restrictions then in force.





At long last, we have managed to get back together. Due to the fact the Baptist Hall is not opening for a while, we have made a decision to move our venue. We had a very successful Coffee Morning/picnic in early June at the Caddington Social Club. The sun was shining and we were able to sit outside. Terri was there to make drinks for us and she was very helpful with chairs etc. We plan to hold more meetings in the Social Club in the future.

Please note a change of Date, due to the Euro 2020 Football events at the Club, we will be meeting on Thursday 8th July at 7.30 p.m.

On this date we will be holding our first official meet. Gill Goode will talk to us on Riding for the Disabled of which she is an active member. Our competition is Horse Memorabilia. A good raffle with tea, coffee, and cakes later on. This will give our Members time to get together and have a chat.

On Tuesday 3rd August, Carol Jones will host a Quiz and we will hold our Annual Meeting when a new Committee will be formed. We still need a Treasurer to help run the meetings plus more committee members. Visitors are more than welcome. Come along and give us a try. You may want to join a local happy group. We organize all sorts of activities, outings, etc.

Tuesday, September 7th is our Birthday meeting, our 66th Year! Future dates and events will be confirmed later.

# Watch the game outside if you can

Getting together outdoors is much safer as COVID-19 spreads much less in the open air. Remember to keep your distance from others. Up to 30 people can meet in an outdoor place such as your garden. However, if you are at a pub garden or similar venue you should use the NHS Test and Trace app to check in.

# Watching inside

You can watch the football inside pubs, but follow the rules in the pub about social distancing and always wear a face covering when you are not sitting down. And remember to check in with Test and Trace.

# Spend the Euros with Crouch on the couch

Every match is on BBC or ITV so you can follow the tournament at home. If you're having friends round, stay outside if you can.

If you're watching indoors you can have up to six people from six households (or two households of any size) indoors. Keep it safe by opening the windows to keep rooms well ventilated, maintaining social distancing and washing your hands regularly.

# **Gardening Notes** by Russell Sprout

By the time you are reading this I hope the weather will have warmed up and we will all be enjoying some warm sunny weather. With such a cold spring it has been difficult to get things to germinate but hopefully everything will catch up.

Deadhead roses on a regular basis to encourage a second flush in the autumn and keep an eye out for greenfly, black spot, mildew and rust. Tie young stems of dahlias to their supports with soft string or raffia and if large blooms are required then disbud the lower buds to get long stems for cutting and arranging in a vase. Chrysanthemums can be treated the same way, but spray varieties should be left, although stake and tie-in shoots to avoid wind damage. Prune deciduous shrubs such as Jasmine and Philadelphus after flowering by removing spent flowers and weak shoots.

Gladioli will not need staking for normal garden use but keep well watered and weed free. Irises can be divided and replanted this month and cut the top half of the leaves off to avoid wind damage. July is the month when lilies are at their best and unless you want to save the seed they should be deadheaded as the flowers fade, water carnations and pinks if the weather is dry. Early this month sow sweet williams and wall flowers for colour in the spring. Rock gardens will look somewhat drab from now until the autumn but best to keep the weeds down to prevent the alpines from being overwhelmed, so keep weeding and trimming alpines and water if necessary. Mounded or carpeting plants not showing new growth should have soil mixture and fertilser worked into them. Patio containers and hanging baskets will require watering at least once a day and deadhead to keep them looking their best.

In the greenhouse tomatoes and cucumbers should be bearing fruit; a liquid fertiliser should be applied every 7-10 days to encourage the fruits to ripen. Blackcurrants can be pruned after fruiting, cutting out the old wood, tie in new shoots of blackberries and loganberries but keep them separate from the fruiting shoots. Summer fruiting raspberries can be cut down as the fruiting canes are finished, but leave the new shoots because they will bear next year's crop. Tidy up the strawberry bed when the fruits are finished.

Complete planting of leeks this month as well as late Brussels, winter cabbage and spring broccoli, also plant swedes by the middle of the month. Keep pinching out the side shoots of tomato plants (except bush varieties) to get decent size fruits. In the herb garden make further sowings of Chervil, Dill and Parsley and remember to harvest just before they come into full bloom if you are going to dry them for future use.

If the weather is hot and dry and there isn't a hosepipe ban, then water the lawn regularly, aerate by spiking with a fork as this will help the water penetrate well below the surface where it's needed to keep it looking green.

Little Princess Trust


Rory Shortall, from Slip End decided to try to grow his hair really long to donate to charity after reading a story in a book about a boy who had done the same.




This wasn't long after his last haircut in June 2018 and the plan was to


