I googled for information and found a special entrance at Tate Britain specifically for disabled and less able visitors. My daughter phoned I told her of my plan - I'm coming with you!

We caught a train from Luton Parkway to St Pancras and then the tube to Pimlico. A walk to Tate Britain to get in the queue for a wristband. It was very busy as this facility was featured on the news and lots of wheelchairs, crutches, walking sticks and every other aid was in the queue. A bright red mobility scooter that looked like a motorbike took my eye but I would probably kill myself with that! We wandered across Lambeth Bridge found a pub and sat talking with others killing time, such nice people.

We walked back across the bridge, sat awhile on a stone seat, watching the queue on the other side. So many different folk, old. young all nationalities. We watched police cars, motorbikes, ambulances with their sirens on and flashing blue lights, buses, delivery vans and lorries. It was fascinating but we got cold sitting still.

We walked down the path towards Westminster Hall. We abandoned our water and our leftover snacks, went through the airport type security, I was frisked because of my crutch!

We were then escorted to an entrance with no steps or stairs, did a bit of a zigzag and low and behold - we were there in the great Hall. It was so quiet, so reverent, so awe inspiring. The queue was halted for us and we took our place, a nod of thanks to the people who had let us in. I could not take my eyes off of the coffin draped with the Royal Standard Flag. On top a wreath of white flowers, the Imperial State Crown, Imperial Orb and Imperial Sceptre, it truly was a site to behold.

We bowed our heads in prayer, respect and reverence. As we filed towards the exit I could not help but look back, I will remember that vista as long as I live. All the people we met, fellow visitors, police, Marshalls, security staff everywhere we went, were so kind and patient towards us.

I am so grateful my daughter came with me, I would have gone by myself, but it was so nice to be able to share this moment in history with her.

PARISH COUNCIL

The latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 5th September in the Village Hall.

Two Planning Applications were discussed this month:

CB/22/03299/FULL – 17 Markyate Road, Slip End – Erection of a two-storey side and single storey front extension and dropped kerb.

CB/22/03389/FULL – 2 Whyleys Cottages, Woodside Road – Single Storey rear extension.

After short discussions it was agreed not to comment on both of these Applications.

Summer Street Speed Survey

Following the recent speed survey undertaken by CBC in Summer Street it was found that 99% of vehicles travelled below the speed limit. Based on these results further action is not justified. However a number of Residents attended the Meeting and pointed out that the results were distorted as the survey was made known beforehand. So it was agreed to ask CBC to repeat the survey again.

Fly Tipping

Residents attending the Meeting also asked about incidents of fly tipping. The Chair said that a CBC grab lorry visits the village on a weekly basis. The Parish Council also continues to push CBC to install covert cameras at fly tipping hot-spots.

Crawley Playground and Youth Shelter

Following a recent ROSPA inspection our supplier (Kompan) will be contacted regarding the replacement of a number of faulty and missing items. The zip wire also needs to be re-tightened and the Parish Council will seek Kompan's advice on the non-slip treads on the ramp as the initial remedial action taken was unsuccessful.

Good Neighbours Scheme

26 guests attended the recent tea party in the Village Hall. The GNS Tombola at the Village Day raised £400. There will be another Tea Party on the 5th October.

Report from Ward Councillor

Cllr. Collins informed the meeting that he has had communications with various agencies dealing with the Mancroft Road flooding issues.

Residents Communications

A resident has pointed out that the bus stop sign outside the former Harrow PH is hanging off. The relevant CBC Officer has been contacted and hopefully it will be fixed shortly.

Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

Well what a summer, but not one for the garden, although saying that the fruit seemed to like it. Time now to get the garden sorted for the winter so you are ready for next season. Remove all annuals before they become too bedraggled. Most hardy perennials should be planted this month unless the soil is very wet in which case wait for a dry spell, or the soil will compact where trodden on. Cut Dahlias down to about six inches above ground level as soon as the frost blackens the leaves, then dig them up using a fork and try not to damage the tubers, dry in a frost free shed for about a week and plant in shallow travs with just enough peat or ash to cover the tubers and keep slightly damp, shoots will appear next spring. Plant border Carnations and Pinks, space border Carnations about 15 – 18 inches apart and Pinks 12 inches apart.

Sweet peas can be sown direct into the ground now or in pots from the middle of the month in a cold greenhouse, plant tulips and Hyacinths this month and into November. Tulips planted earlier may be damaged by frost and may suffer tulip fire disease. Chrysanthemums can either be left in the ground to over-winter but do not cut the tops down until spring, or lift the stools, cut the tops down and plant them at the same depth they were growing at in a cold frame or greenhouse and take cuttings in the spring but do remember to label them before lifting. Gladioli do not fare well if left in the ground to over-winter so lift them about the second week of the month and dry them off thoroughly then cut the stem just above the corm, the roots can be removed as soon as they are dry. Store them in a frost free environment and replant in the spring.

Cut out the canes that carried this year's fruit from Blackberries and Loganberries and summer fruiting Raspberries and tie in the new shoots to a wire or frame. Complete the planting of strawberries this month for fruiting next year and clear all rubbish from established beds. Towards the end of the month plant all types of hardy deciduous trees and shrubs but not in frosty weather or strong winds.

If you have a pond you should be thinking about preparing it for the winter by drastically thinning out underwater oxygenating plants and remove old water lily leaves. This will avoid the presence of a great deal of decaying vegetation on the base of the pond when the water is iced over, and will minimise the formation of toxic gases and prevent a shortage of oxygen. If the water looks dark green or blackish, drain off half the volume and replace with fresh water.
