Thanks to those who organised that as well as the annual visit from Santa on his float. (see p 15)

The Warm Space in the Rising Sun continues this month —see the poster for details. There are always other coffee mornings (at the churches) and the chatty club among others which give opportunities for conversation and refreshment.

The on-going effects of the pandemic have caused many people to change their habits and that has had a knock on effect on many organisations, clubs and charities. One such club affected by lack of numbers is the Photography Club which has sadly agreed to close. Please see the report for more details. I hope that some of the local members will still send us photos to include in the magazine and brighten up our pages.

One piece of good news:- We submitted two magazines into the Annual Parish Magazine Awards and were told that we came 25th in the A5 category, out of 450 entries.

Note The 231 bus was withdrawn due to low passenger usage. A partial replacement has been provided between Caddington & Luton by an enhanced service 230. Central Bedfordshire Council and CaSE Community Trust are working jointly with Centrebus to support an enhanced 230 bus service which launched in January.

The new service will operate on an hourly basis throughout the day, Mondays to Saturdays, linking Caddington Woods, Caddington, Woodside and Slip End to Luton Airport Parkway, Luton Interchange and the L&D Hospital. The service will also call at Skimpot Tescos. The service will be free of charge to all passengers, sponsored by CaSE Community Trust! See timetable on page 27.

The latest Parish Council Meetings were held on Monday 5th December and Monday 9th January in the Village Hall.

December Meeting

One Planning Application was discussed this month:

CB/22/04389/FULL – 47 Woodside Road, Woodside – Part two storey and part single storey side extension.

After a short discussion, it was agreed not to comment on this Planning Application.

Report by Ward Councillor

Cllr. Collins reported that he had received an email from the Clerk at Aley Green Cemetery that there were concerns about the amount of rainwater flowing through Aley Cemetery on to Mancroft Road and that proposed new developments would make the situation worse. Cllr. Collins said this would be taken into account and thanked the Parish Council for their feedback.

Cllr. Collins informed the Parish Council that he attended a meeting at Luton Borough Council where the Newlands Road Development Application was discussed. The Meeting acknowledged the traffic concerns regarding Newlands Road and the potential problems in Front Street and Half Moon Lane. Despite concerns the Planning Application for the northern site was approved. The option for a Park and Ride site at the southern development will be kept open for a discussion at a later date

Cllr. Collins provided an update for the revised 230 bus route paid for by the CaSE Trust and the end of the 231 bus service. These changes have now taken place.

2023/2024 Budget Proposal

A 2023/2024 Budget was approved. The Parish Council will make use of its reserves so that the Precept is reduced from £55,000 to £50,000, a 9.1% reduction. This means a Band D property will now pay £68.87 a year, down from £75.45 a year, a reduction of 8.7%.

January Meeting

One Planning Application was discussed this month:

CB/22/04901/FULL - Field to the South of Woodside Road, opposite Woodside farm and 171 Woodside Road, Woodside. Change of use of agricultural land to a dog exercise area, including laying a hard standing parking and manoeuvring area, fencing and improving the on-site access.

The Parish Council will make a request to CBC Planning that if the field ceases to be used for dog exercise it should revert back to agriculture use.

Good Neighbour Scheme

Volunteers have successfully distributed Christmas biscuits to elderly Parish residents. So far 52 residents have attended the soup and sandwich event at the Rising Sun over the past 3 weeks.

Report by Ward Councillor

Cllr. Collins reported that Thames Water had launched a Flooding Grant Scheme and funds of up to £50,000 may be made available from this for extra work in flood prone areas.

Parish Council Matters

The Parish Clerk will leave at the end of April. Interviews for a replacement took place in January. The Parish Council Chairman will



be standing down prior to the February Parish Council meeting.


Breakfast with Santa

Message from St Andrew's

In our church calendar the festive season of Christmas, celebrating the birth of Christ, was concluded with the Epiphany, his first appearance to non-Jews. We are now into four Sundays of 'Ordinary Time' before the season of Lent comes round once again. Ash Wednesday kicks it off on 22nd February, 46 days before Easter Sunday.

The hours of daylight are unquestionably lengthening. The signs of spring are evident in budding greenery, as the earth begins a miraculous transformation. After a time of winter rest the earth is stirring with a new energy, as our corner of the globe takes its gradual turn for renewal. The bible teaches that the four seasons are God's handiwork. It is not an accident that He created them. Each one has a purpose. We may not see it while scraping ice off our windscreen, and the streets are slushy, slick, and dirty. Nevertheless, God's good design for the earth will bear fruit. Isaiah the prophet had this in mind when he wrote in Isaiah 55:10,

As the rain and the snow come down from heaven, and do not return to it without watering the earth and making it bud and flourish, so that it yields seed for the sower and bread for the eater, so is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it.

And coming full circle, one of the reasons the church follows a liturgical calendar is for an unveiling of God and his word. Organised around the events of the life of Jesus Christ, the calendar helps to frame and organise our time and our lives with a focus on him. Following a calendar formed around the biblical lectionary allows the church to go through the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus and the gift of the Spirit, every year. And we can all discover his purposes for our lives as we walk with him through the seasons.



Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

With Christmas and New Year now a distant memory it's time to turn our thoughts to the gardening year. Clear away any dead plant material and keep on top of weeds as they start into growth. If you have a soil testing kit this is a good time to test to see if lime, nitrogen or potash is required to balance the soil. This is quite easy to do, just follow the instructions that come with the kit, you don't have to be a scientist.

Check Dahlias in store, cut away any rotted sections of tubers and if they are shriveled plunge them into tepid water for 10-12 hours. Take cuttings of Chrysanthemums that have been over-wintered in the greenhouse or cold frame as soon as the new shoots are big enough. Stools that have been left in the ground will benefit from pushing a fork into the ground around the plant to stop rotting and clear away any weeds or debris that have accumulated. Any alpines that have been loosened by frost should be firmed into place and weeded. If the lawn has become wet and boggy with all the rain we have had, aerate with a fork to help drainage and scarify towards the end of the month to remove dead grass and thatch if conditions are dry enough.

Mint can be propagated now by digging up the runners just below the surface, separate them from the main plant, cut into lengths of approximately 6" long and plant. Mint is best planted in a container to stop it spreading everywhere. Parsley can be sown outdoors if dry and not too cold for a first crop. Prune autumn fruiting raspberries close to the ground by the end of the month.

Early potatoes can be arranged in boxes or seed trays with the eyes uppermost in a light frost-free shed, greenhouse or cool bedroom to sprout into growth for an early crop. If you haven't got your seed potatoes yet don't delay or you will be left with the dregs. Early peas and broad beans can be planted in the soil towards the end of the month if it is dry. Shallots can also be planted this month and just cover them with soil to stop birds from pulling them out of the ground. If you plan to plant tomatoes in a cool greenhouse in April now is the time to sow seeds in a propagator or indoors on a windowsill and pot them on when they are about 2" high.

LUTON AIRPORT INCREASE IN PASSENGER NUMBERS

Villagers may be interested in the following information obtained from **LADACAN** and submitted by a local resident.

(LADACAN—Luton and District Association for the Control of Aircraft Noise)

The Planning Inquiry into Luton Airport's application to legitimise noise breaches gave LADACAN the chance to ask some really searching questions and reveal some stark truths.

Never before has the lid been lifted on the motives and actions of the Airport Operator, deficiencies in its noise monitoring, or how the airlines call the shots. Luton is paranoid about losing business to Stansted and uses that as a justification for prioritising growth over noise reduction.

The Planning Inspectors will make their recommendation to the Secretaries of State in a month or two. In the meantime, LADACAN shall continue to challenge the mentality that the Airport is **entitled** to reach its passenger limit regardless of its noise controls or whether or not the newer planes are quieter, and that if noise breaches are judged to be **negligible** based on dodgy noise contours, no action need be taken.

The Inspectors were very unimpressed by the lack of a proper assessment of further passenger traffic on the already crowded transport infrastructure - so anyone with knowledge of transport planning should sharpen their pencils since it's obviously a key vulnerability.

For information, **LADACAN** is a community group which represents people who are affected by the noise from Luton Airport and concerned about its growing impacts on climate change and local quality of life.

It has a seat on the Luton Airport Consultative Committee (LLACC) and its Noise and Track Sub-Committee (NTSC), both of which meet quarterly to discuss issues affecting local communities. Because Luton is the only major UK airport owned by a local authority, there are particular issues over governance and conflict of interest, and we highlight those as necessary.

The Committee are all volunteers, relying on donations from members to support their work. Costs include website hosting, targeted legal advice, producing leaflets and placards, hiring meeting rooms, travel, and access to data and specialist software.
