LONDON LUTON AIRPORT EXPANSION



If you had an A4 envelope through the door and did not understand what they wanted, here are the key points you need to know:

They're writing to you because you MIGHT be someone entitled to compensation as a result of the development.

Your 'land' is NOT required for the proposed development, and will NOT be subject to 'compulsory purchase'.

The Streetworks Team at Central Bedfordshire Council have a request for a Temporary Road Closure at the above location to enable Pre Surface Dressing/ Surface Dressing to take place safely. Fly Tipping

All appears quiet on the western front – maybe we spoke too soon. The usual hotspots have been relatively quiet and we understand Woodside Road between Upper Woodside and Luton Road is also fairly free of fly tipping. The chairman continues to monitor the known locations and report any tipping as she comes across it.

Likewise, residents can also report any fly tipping using the FixMyStreet app on their mobile devices. If you haven't already, we recommend downloading the app and creating an account. You can log in and easily report any issues from fly tipping to potholes, grass verges overgrown, pavement issues, and you can track your report as its dealt with. You can also access it on your laptop or computer at www.fixmystreet.com.

In the week of Tuesday 6th June FixMyStreet received 17,335 reports (nationwide) and repaired 29,277 issues (nationwide). You can use the app anywhere in the UK to report any issues, not just locally.



We have been very busy since the last issue and have:

- had 3 pool companies on site to give us quotes for repair work
- had a builder look at the viability of installing a changing room/shower
- found a number of community funds that we can apply for, and will also look to set up a Crowdfunder with Sport England, (where they will double anything we could raise through match funding, up to £10,000)
- continued to meet with the school to keep them up to date with progress agreed with the school, that we can operate as a community group to work alongside them
- applied for a community bank account so that we are in a position to fundraise, if the Governing Body are happy for us to proceed

Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

As I write this we are enjoying some warm sunny weather but are desperate for some rain after an unusually dry April, never happy are we! Just hope when we get some it knows when to stop.

Deadhead roses on a regular basis to encourage a second flush in the autumn and keep an eye out for greenfly, black spot, mildew and rust. Tie young stems of Dahlias to their supports with soft string or raffia and if large blooms are required then disbud the lower buds to get long stems for cutting and arranging in a vase. Chrysanthemums can be treated the same way, but spray varieties should be left, although stake and tie-in shoots to avoid wind damage. Prune deciduous shrubs such as Jasmine and Philadelphus after flowering by removing spent flowers and weak shoots.

Gladioli will not need staking for normal garden use but keep well watered and weed free. Irises can be divided and replanted this month and cut the top half of the leaves off to avoid wind damage. July is the month when lilies are at their best and unless you want to save the seed they should be deadheaded as the flowers fade, water carnations and pinks if the weather is dry. Early this month sow Sweet Williams and Wall Flowers for colour in the spring. Rock gardens will look somewhat drab from now until the autumn but best to keep the weeds down to prevent the alpines from being overwhelmed, so keep weeding and trimming alpines and water if necessary. Mounded or carpeting plants not showing new growth should have soil mixture and fertilser worked into them. Patio containers and hanging baskets will require watering at least once a day and deadhead to keep them looking their best.

In the greenhouse tomatoes and cucumbers should be bearing fruit; a liquid fertiliser should be applied every 7-10 days to encourage the fruits to ripen. Blackcurrants can be pruned after fruiting, cutting out the old wood, tie in new shoots of blackberries and loganberries but keep them separate from the fruiting shoots. Summer fruiting raspberries can be cut down as the fruiting canes are finished, but leave the new shoots because they will bear next year's crop. Tidy up the strawberry bed when the fruits are finished.

Complete planting of leeks this month as well as late brussel sprouts, winter cabbage and spring broccoli, also plant swedes by the middle of the month. Keep pinching out the side shoots of tomato plants (except bush varieties) to get decent size fruits. In the herb garden make further sowings of Chervil, Dill and Parsley and remember to harvest just before they come into full bloom if you are going to dry them for future use.


