#### **Visitors**

Mr Young, the new headmaster at Slip End School, came along to the October meeting to introduce himself. The Chair had met him previously at this years Village Day where he sportingly donned an inflatable dragon costume and took part in the assault course race. Mr Young is keen to bring the academic standards of the school up and thanked councillors for the funding for the interactive white board at the school. The library is almost finished and we are invited to come and see it when it's up and running. Parish Council looks forward to working alongside the school where possible.

Our second visitor was Ian Dalgarno, our Deputy Police and Crime Commissioner. Ian explained to councillors where the Beds force are targeting their resources, mainly drugs, anti-social behaviour and motorbikes riding in rural areas. Ian has asked councillors to report issues to him directly if any issues the parish has aren't getting the resolve or attention we feel they should. Chair did say that our crime stats continue to be low in comparison to other villages and parishes in the county and we hope to keep it that way.

#### Flood Working Group

Councillors approved the purchase of a used shipping container to store our parish flood equipment. This will be centrally located and easily accessible to all the members of the flood group should they need to deploy equipment. We had another severe flooding incident at Aley Green and Mancroft Road on Wednesday 20th September; the chair and a Lower Woodside resident deployed several items of equipment at 10pm and Central Bedfordshire Council Highways and Thames Water dealt with the clear up the next day. One driver

unfortunately lost his vehicle to the flood water and had to be rescued. Other usual flooding hot spots were affected – Grove Road, Markyate Road and Woodside Road. The flood group are in contact with Central Beds to get the main drains that need attention repaired so they can cope better with large deposits of water.

#### Christmas Tree

Good Elf, our approved Christmas tree supplier, will be supplying our tree again this year, councillors approved the expenditure, which is exactly the same cost as last year. The tree will be in place before the Christmas light switch on.

#### **Residents Parking Scheme**

Chair has had a few comments in relation to last months article, and will be putting together a survey to be sent out as soon as possible.

#### Message from St Andrew's

On 12<sup>th</sup> November St Andrew's will be holding a service of Remembrance. The village's war memorial is within the church. At the service the names of those from the parish who died in the two World Wars will be read out. In doing so, we remember ALL those impacted by their death. They were sons of grieving mothers. Perhaps they were brothers, had children, and workmates, and old school friends. Their sacrifice left a huge gap.

Even when war is necessary it is not good. Even justified war is hell. It destroys the work of peace turning life into death, leaving those caught up in it – whether armed forces or civilians – to carry the wounds of war, and often passing the wounds down to future generations. We remember that too.

Remembering is a big part of Christian worship. Each time we take bread and wine at Communion we do this in remembrance of Jesus and his sacrifice for us. They represent his body broken for us and his blood shed for us

Remembering is not just about the past. It involves calling to mind God's will for our lives NOW. Jesus told us to love our neighbours as ourselves. That word "neighbour" is broadly drawn, not based on a postcode, for example the collection at the Remembrance service will go to the Royal British Legion. And again, at the end of November we will be holding a Christingle service where the collection will go to the work of the Children's Society.

The Christingle service is very different in What each part of a tone to the formal Remembrance service, with the church set out café style and an opportunity to form a big circle with lit Christingles as the lights are dimmed. (Stressful for the churchwarden, but fun for the rest of us!)

We hope you can join us at our services and/or at the community coffee morning (25<sup>th</sup> November).

#### Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

Thankfully, we finally got a few nice days to enjoy before autumn and winter sets in, and this has hopefully given you the opportunity to get some tidying up done around the garden, sparing a thought for the wildlife and not being too ruthless I hope!

Ventilate the greenhouse on sunny days if you still have tomatoes ripening but close them in the afternoon to help keep in some heat. Alternatively, pick your tomatoes and bring them inside to ripen off. White fly can be a problem at this time of year so fumigate with a HCH smoke or spray to eradicate this problem.

Clear up any fallen leaves and add them to the compost heap, or use them to make your own leaf-mould, (but do check that they don't have black spot). Roses planted this month will get off to a good start but only plant them as deep as the old soil mark on the stem. Climbing and rambling roses need to be planted at least fifteen inches away from a wall to avoid lack of water to the roots. Lift tender plants like fuchsias, begonias and geraniums, and bring inside to over-winter if you haven't already done so.

Blackcurrant bushes will require some of the old wood removing but leave as much new growth as possible, treat gooseberries in much the same way. If you are planting fruit trees, then prune back by about two-thirds of the young shoot straight afterwards. Prune blackberries, raspberries and loganberries cutting out all this year's fruiting shoots and tie in new ones and cut out any weak ones. Continue digging as ground becomes vacant and leave for the frosts to break down over the winter. Don't be too zealous, remember that wildlife need somewhere to overwinter and don't forget to **check that bonfire for hedgehogs before you light it!** 

Check dahlia tubers for drying out and if they appear shriveled soak them in tepid water for the night. Remove any parts of the tubers that start to rot with a sharp knife and dust them with flowers of sulphur. Check chrysanthemums left in the soil for water logging and insert a fork to it's full depth to aid drainage, stools taken in over winter should be kept moist but not wet. Gladioli corms can be cleaned up any time during the winter and discard any that are diseased and try to grow gladioli in a different position each year to stop dry rot, fusarium rot and botrytis. Continue to plant border carnations and pinks during mild spells and complete planting tulips and hyacinths as soon as possible.

If you have a pond finish preparing for winter by removing old leaves and thinning oxygenating plants. Leave foliage on marginal reeds and rushes as a protection against severe weather. Protect the pool against falling leaves by covering it with small-mesh netting. Overhaul pumps used for waterfalls and fountains, removing submersible types from the water and storing them in a dry place.

There is a Gardening Club meeting in the village hall this month, it's on Monday 20 November, 8pm start, visitors welcome (£2) and the speaker is Beverley Bond, she is giving a talk on growing herbs which should be very interesting, why not come along!


