#### Flood Assistance

With the financial support of Central Bedfordshire Council, Slip End Parish Council has acquired items to help residents in case of another serious flooding incident.

Most items will be stored in a secure location and when everything is fully sorted out we will supply details of key holders who will be able to access the items.

In the meantime there are some items we can distribute to residents now. These will be for Slip End Parish residents only. Those residents living in Caddington Parish should be aware that similar funding has been made available to Caddington Parish Council. Just as a reminder, Slip End Parish covers Woodside Road and Mancroft Road from the junction with Woodside Road to the Cemetery.

The items we plan to make directly available to residents are:

- 1. Sandbags to hold 12.5Kg of sand. However these will be the bags only. Residents will need to fill them with sand themselves.
- 2. Hydrosnakes 145cms x 25cms. These are designed to absorb up to 20 litres of water. It is important they are kept in a dry location so they have maximum effect when deployed.
- 3. Hydrosacks 60cms x 46cms. Like the Hydrosnakes they are designed to absorb up to 20 litres of water and should be stored in a dry location for maximum efficiency when deployed.

So if you have been subject to flooding, or you believe you may be subject to flooding in the future, please let the Parish Clerk know (clerk@slipendparishcouncil.co.uk 07487 850249) which items you would like and in what quantity. In case of over subscription we may need to cut back on the quantities requested.

#### Fly Tipping

I have kept in contact with Central Bedfordshire Council over the summer about the many fly tips along Woodside Road (9 in one week) and would like to thank one of our residents who keeps me regularly up to date with his reporting to CBC.

Again, I would like to reiterate to residents the quickest way to report any incidents of fly tipping is using the FixMyStreet app or website. CBC have advised me that their employees will use it to report incidents sent to them on email or by phone, so using it yourself cuts out the middleman. You can report anything on it – potholes, street lights, paving, overgrown verges, fly tipping – the options are there, and it will keep you up to date with progress on the incident you report - www.fixmystreet.com

#### **Residents Parking Scheme**

- 2) There needs to be a large or total majority in agreement to any scheme for it to have legs
- 3) Any potential scheme will not be up and running within weeks this will be a lengthy process

#### Message from St Andrew's

If you're sitting comfortably then I'll begin. Do you recognise the phrase from Listen with Mother? Or perhaps you are too young! Perhaps your memories of storytelling are from Jackanory or CBeebies Bedtime Stories.

As you can imagine, the Bible is packed full of stories. Jesus loved a good story. We often refer to them as parables. It is often said that a parable is an earthly story with a heavenly meaning. Tennyson called them "Truth embodied in a tale." They are a memorable way to explain something – often about the Kingdom of God. Jesus usually used the ingredients of everyday life to tell his parables, such as farming or food or entertaining.

Aesop's fables usually conclude with a moral of the story. Sometimes Jesus does something similar, ending with a summary or a question, e.g. at the end of the Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10: 30-37) he asks, "which of these three do you think seemed to be a neighbour to him who fell among the robbers?" and then says, "Go and do likewise."

At St Andrew's we have been hearing quite a few parables from the Gospel of Matthew over the last few months. As our sermons open up their meaning we hope that we too can "go and do likewise". Stories are also a key part of our Little Stars sessions each Wednesday morning. They are the bones on which we hang the Holiday Fun Day (Friday 27th October – see advert elsewhere in this magazine—p 15.)

The Parable of the Good Samaritan provides a good story to explain the rationale for our Blythswood Care Shoebox Appeal for which we will be preparing shoeboxes on the Fun Day and at the Family Service on Sunday 29th October. You are very welcome to come along and see how we put the lesson of that particular parable into practice, as we do something to help our neighbours. ### Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

We certainly don't get summers like we used to, what a contrast to last year, it was swings and roundabouts in the garden, some things thrived, others struggled, but then that's gardening for you! Time now to get the garden sorted for the winter so you are ready for next season. Remove all annuals before they become too bedraggled. Most hardy perennials should be planted this month unless the soil is very wet in which case wait for a dry spell, or the soil will compact where trodden on. Cut Dahlias down to about six inches above ground level as soon as the frost blackens the leaves, then dig them up using a fork and try not to damage the tubers, dry in a frost free shed for about a week and plant in shallow trays with just enough peat or ash to cover the tubers and keep slightly damp, shoots will appear next spring. Sweet peas can be sown direct into the ground now or in pots from the middle of the month in a cold greenhouse, plant tulips and Hyacinths this month and into November. Tulips planted earlier may be damaged by frost and may suffer tulip fire disease. Plant border Carnations and Pinks, space border Carnations about 15 – 18 inches apart and Pinks 12 inches apart.

Chrysanthemums can either be left in the ground to over-winter but do not cut the tops down until spring, or lift the stools, cut the tops down and plant them at the same depth they were growing at in a cold frame or greenhouse and take cuttings in the spring but do remember to label them before lifting. Gladioli do not fare well if left in the ground to over-winter so lift them about the second week of the month and dry them off thoroughly then cut the stem just above the corm, the roots can be removed as soon as they are dry. Store them in a frost free environment and replant in the spring.

Cut out the canes that carried this year's fruit from Blackberries and Loganberries and summer fruiting Raspberries and tie in the new shoots to a wire or frame. Complete the planting of strawberries this month for fruiting next year and clear all rubbish from established beds. Towards the end of the month plant all types of hardy deciduous trees and shrubs but not in frosty weather or strong winds.

If you have a pond you should be thinking about preparing it for the winter by drastically thinning out underwater oxygenating plants and remove old water lily leaves. This will avoid the presence of a great deal of decaying vegetation on the base of the pond when the water is iced over, and will minimize the formation of toxic gases and prevent a shortage of oxygen. If the water looks dark green or blackish, drain off half the volume and replace with fresh water.

That's all for now, see you next month.

#### Summary of the meeting held on 22th August at 1pm in the surgery

The new triage system was discussed and it was brought up that the link to the triage form was not obvious and that some of the older patients either did not have the internet or were not computer literate. We were advised that they could either telephone the surgery of call in and the reception staff would fill in the form,

On receipt of the form a doctor will assess the information and decide the appropriate action. They would then contact the patient by telephone call or mobile text message. If by text and an appointment is needed there would be included a link with various dates and times for the patient to choose from.

In the home page at the Caddington Surgery website if you click on appointments and scroll down there are two videos explaining how to use the system.

It was suggested that a leaflet be created showing how the system worked, John Larsen is looking into this.

It was also mentioned that several patients had had their appointments cancelled on the morning of the appointment 2 or 3 times running due to sickness. The surgery will investigate this.

We also had a complaint about the time it was taking for medication reviews to happen. This is due to the surgery being a pharmacist short, they are advertising and hope to have the vacancy filled shortly.

The date of the next meeting is Tuesday October 17<sup>th</sup>.

It was also discussed the need to advertise and recruit more members to the PPG. Priscilla already put out leaflets in the surgery and John will take some leaflets and leave in the Coffee morning and also try to add it the village magazine.

#### An update from Swim Slip End



During September we packed our inflatables and paddling pool and had a great day out at the Caddington Village Day.




