Young Person's Sanctuary: Supporting young people's mental health across Luton

As a fellow resident of Slip End, I am hoping to spread the word about a new drop-in service for young people who are experiencing mental health struggles or self-defined crisis. I work with a charity called Mind BLMK, who offer a variety of mental health and wellbeing support services across the Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes area.

Mind BLMK's Young Person's Sanctuary is a new service for 14–17-year-olds, open from 4-10pm, 365-days a year. We are located at ResoLUTiONs Youth Hub, 89 Castle Street, LU1 3AJ (opposite Matalan) – approx. 7 minutes' drive from Slip End village.

Young people are welcome to drop in after school, at weekends, or during school holidays. We hope to help bridge the gap between the support offered in schools and the clinical support offered by CAMHS. Young people do not have to be under CAMHS or have any formal diagnosis to access the Young Person's Sanctuary – anyone aged 14-17 can drop in for a 1-to-1, holistic and personcentred intervention.

We understand that it is not always easy to know where to turn in moments of crisis or distress, and waiting for an appointment to come around can be difficult. At the Young Person's Sanctuary, there is always someone here to listen, so there is no need to book an appointment. We can provide a calm, relaxed and nonjudgmental space for young people to talk openly, and explore the ways in which we can help. We can also provide information about other services/resources that are available locally, and provide support with accessing these.

For those living outside the Luton area, Mind BLMK also have Young Person's Sanctuaries in Leighton Buzzard, Houghton Regis, and Bedford, as well as a wide variety of other services that can be found on the website:

Hart Lane, Luton, garden was a small gem, with year-round seasonal plants, mature shrubs, a relaxing water feature and different seating areas to enjoy the garden. 

An update from Swim Slip End

Thank you to everyone who completed our community survey. Together with the parent surveys from Slip End and Caddington schools we had over 250 responses, an overwhelming response which we are really grateful for!

The highlights were:

- 96% of you felt that both the schools and residents would benefit from a community swimming pool
- 46% of parents and 36% of the community said they had experienced difficulties accessing swimming lessons locally
- 91% said they were either 'very likely' or 'likely' to use a community pool

Where are we now?

We are now an established community group called Swim Slip End with a committee and a community bank account. We'll be holding our first full committee meeting at the end of August so please get in touch on the email address below if you'd like to come along, we'd love to have more members!

The Governing Body of Slip End Village School has now approved 'Phase 1' of the project which is to repair the pool so it can be used by both schools for swimming lessons as soon as possible (hopefully by Spring 2024).

The Phase 1 work will cost nearly £19,000. We have secured £15,000 from Be Active Beds as part of the Department for Education's 'Opening School Facilities Fund' designed to open school facilities to the local community.

Phase 2 is to upgrade the pool's efficiency and capability so that it can be used by the community and phase 3 will be to create accessible changing facilities including toilets and showers.

SWIMTEMBER

During September we will be running SWIMTEMBER – a month focused on fundraising. We'll launch our Crowdfunder website where people will be able to pledge money towards the project – we'll be hoping to raise £10,000 in pledges by offering rewards for people to buy as well as holding fundraising events. If we're successful Sport England will match-fund us another £10,000.

We'll be giving pupils from both schools a challenge to complete 10 activities throughout the month which families and friends can sponsor them for.

It's a huge task but we'll give it our best shot!

We need your help!

Could you offer a reward for our Crowdfunder? It could be anything from:

- a physical prize or gift that people can buy
- a service you could offer such as a personal fitness session, an hour of gardening, a swimming or music lesson
- something homemade or homegrown a cake, afternoon tea, veg from your garden

Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

What an awful summer, if you can call it that! Let's hope we get an Indian Summer otherwise it is going to seem a long winter. One thing we can't control is the weather, and despite the rain, wind and cold, some things have grown well and have given a good harvest.

New growth on climbers should be tied in to stop them from getting damaged by the wind, but make ties loose enough to allow for the thickening of the stems as they develop. As annuals start to fade remove them so that spring bedding plants can be planted towards the end of the month, such as wallflowers, polyanthus, forget-me-nots and sweet williams. Bulbs such as daffodils, hyacinths, tulips and crocuses can also be planted at the same time. Keep dead-heading roses, cuttings can be taken now, about 12" long, remove all the thorns and trim top and bottom leaving just the upper pair of leaves and insert into the soil so that the lowest leaf is just above the soil, these will take about a year to root and be ready to transplant.

If you have grown large type dahlias or chrysanthemums it would be a good idea to stake them to stop the wind breaking them and if cutting for the vase do it when the blooms are well opened. If you intend to take cuttings from the root stock of chrysanthemums it is a good idea to label them whilst you can tell what colours they are, or like me you will forget and have to go for pot luck next year! Gladioli corms should be left in the ground to mature until next month, although the tops may turn brown.

Towards the end of the month alpines can be replanted and this month is a good time to make a rockery. Make sure it is free draining and will not become too wet, as the plants will rot, so make sure there is plenty of rubble as a base and finer rubble as a top layer.

Harvest soft fruit as it ripens and when they have finished fruiting cut out all the old wood and tie in the new shoots. Spring cabbages can be planted out towards the end of the month, plant close together in the rows and as they get going in the spring pull every other one out and use as leaf greens and leave the others to mature and heart up. Apples and pears can be stored if you cannot use them all right now, but make sure the stalk is attached to the fruit (otherwise they will not store well) and the fruit has no blemishes. Wrap them individually in paper and place in a cool, dark, dry place such as a shed, but watch out for mice or they will eat them before you do! Check once a week for any that need discarding or using. Remove any shading from greenhouses as the plants will require more light and the sun starts to lose it's fierce heat.
