Message from Nick

Scripture Reading: 12.32 - 40
Always ready

As human beings, there will be a multitude of things that we may worry about from time to time. Likewise, for Christians there are things specific to being a disciple of Jesus, that may seem to give cause for worry. The verses in our reading carry three exhortations for disciples. First, do not be afraid. Secondly, store up heavenly treasure and third, always be ready for the Kingdom of God. Ultimately, Jesus' desire for his disciples is that in place of worry, in place of fear, they would rest in readiness in his kingdom. The parable ends with a reminder that the King is coming, he will return.

Being ready means both staying alert to his return as well as keeping our lives focussed on the things of the kingdom. Believers are called to keep alight their lamps with the light of hope. Allowing God to be Lord in our lives, while waiting for him. In complete trust and suitably prepared for his return. He has a feast set up and when he comes believers will rejoice in it. He will have his disciples sit down to eat and he will come and serve them! How awesome is that!
