The calling of the first Disciples

Collect for the Third Sunday of Epiphany

God of all mercy, your Son proclaimed good news to the poor, release to the captives and freedom to the oppressed. Anoint us with your Holy Spirit and set all your people free to praise you in Christ our Lord. Amen

Message from Richard

Our reading is Matthew 4 vv 18-22

The passage begins, 'As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee'. I don't believe Jesus was simply out for a stroll that day. I believe he knew exactly what he was doing and who he was going to meet. He met Simon, Andrew, then James and John. He initially said three words, 'Come, follow me.'

The story goes on, 'At once they left their nets and followed him.' **At once!!** It was likely that this was not the first time that they had seen Jesus, or Jesus had seen them. They had probably heard Jesus speaking, but at this moment there came to them this challenge, 'Follow me.' A call that changed their lives for ever. This begs the question, how has my life, your life, been changed because you and I have had that call and responded. What nets do I need to leave in order to follow Jesus wholeheartedly? What obstacles, what material attachments? What comfort zones have wound themselves so tightly around me that I find it hard to get up and follow him?


The challenge goes further. 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of people. Not, I think you ought to be fishers of people, but I will **make** you fishers of people. Jesus is telling these disciples to cast their nets over others in order to catch people for the Kingdom of God. **Jesus said elsewhere**, 'go and make disciples of all nations'. He said **'you will be my witnesses'**. You may think that is too much outside your comfort zone.

Jesus said, 'You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you will be my witnesses.' We don't cast our nets alone, we cast them in the power of the Holy Spirit. The challenge is, first to follow, then go and bring others into the Kingdom. It was ordinary men whom Jesus chose and it's ordinary folk like you and me that he chooses today.
