Collect for the Transfiguration of our Lord

Father in heaven, whose Son Jesus Christ was wonderfully transfigured before chosen witnesses upon the holy mountain and spoke of the exodus he would accomplish at Jerusalem: give us strength so to hear his voice and bear our cross, that in the world to come we may see him as he is; who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen.

Message from Julie

Our Bible readings are Exodus 24 vv 12-18 & Matthew 17 vv 1- 9

Our Gospel reading tells the story of the Transfiguration, a key event which appears in all three synoptic gospels and is referred to in 2 Peter 1: 16-19.

- **The Event:** Jesus's face shone like the sun and his clothing became dazzlingly white.
- **Location:** a 'high mountain' i.e. close to God (think about Moses and Elijah's experiences of encountering God on mountain tops).
- **Appearance of Prophets:** Moses and Elijah appeared with Jesus, representing the Law and the Prophets, respectively.
- **Divine Voice:** A voice from a bright cloud, God the Father, affirmed, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased. Listen to him".

This is a rich tapestry of meaning that helps us to see the nature of Jesus Christ and his mission. He is indeed the Son of God. This revelation of his divinity, before he sets his face to Jerusalem and the fate that awaits him there, is a reassurance about God's plan of salvation. His death does not thwart his earthly ministry; it is its culmination.

The Father's voice says to the disciples "Listen to him!" And that is a message to us too. We should listen to the words of Jesus. Yes, listen even when he says things that are hard to understand or which we don't like the sound of. Listen because his word is reliable. He told the disciples everything that would happen and it came to pass just as he said.

So as Lent begins this week let us make time to listen to Jesus and meditate on his words "as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in our hearts" (2 Peter 1: 19b).
