LUTON AIRPORT'S BID TO SET ASIDE NOISE LIMITS IS CALLED IN BY SECRETARY OF STATE

The Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities has called-in Luton Borough Council's December decision to set aside the noise and growth limits imposed on Luton Airport until 2028. The controversial planning decision led to immediate calls from local campaign groups, MPs and Councils, for the Secretary of State to intervene. In its decision letter, the DLUHC cites concerns over climate change, policies for enhancing the natural environment, and the local development plan which was to be set aside to allow more airport growth. Campaigners have welcomed the decision as enabling the national Planning Inspectorate to review what many feel is a conflicted situation in which the Council derives significant revenue from the Airport but is also responsible for planning decisions which affect its environmental impacts on the whole local area.

PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

The latest Parish Council Meeting was held on Monday 4th April in the Village Hall.

One Planning Application was discussed this month:

CB/22/00979/FULL – Land next to 78 Woodside Road, Woodside –
Erection of one bedroom dwelling with parking.

It was agreed to object to this application for the following reasons:

1. Inappropriate development within the Green Belt.
2. Over-development of the plot.
3. Parking.
4. The mixing of both cars and pedestrians on the Heritage Greenway.

Consideration of Grant Applications

A total of 7 Grant requests were considered.

The following 5 Grant requests were approved in full:

Parish News - £2,600

Good Neighbour Scheme - £960

1st Woodside Brownies - £497

Slip End Carpet Bowls - £300

Slip End Playing Fields - £4,000

The poor design of their current pump pit is contributing to pump breakdowns and replacements on a regular basis, and a replacement pit is needed to resolve the problems.

The Playing Fields Committee has also requested funds from several additional sources and if successful the full £4,000 Grant may not be needed.

The decision on the following 2 Grant requests will be discussed at the May meeting, once additional requested information has been received:
FoSELS – A Grant of £2,332.94 was requested.

Slip End Pre-School – A Grant of £1,500 was requested.

Good Neighbour Scheme

A GNS Easter party was held at the Village Hall on the 13th April. The committee will also run a Tombola at the Village Day on Saturday the 9th July to help raise funds.

Airport Expansion

The Parish Council has lodged a very comprehensive objection to the Airport Expansion Consultation.

Highways and Footpaths

The speed survey in Summer Street should take place in late April or early May.

CBC Update

CBC will run a consultation into the need for a Residents Parking Scheme in Slip End.

Both CBC and Cllr. Collins have responded to the Airport Expansion Consultation. Important issues raised were noise mitigation and elimination of night flights.

The CBC flood team will be visiting Mancroft Road to discuss measures needed at this flooding hot spot.

It is hoped that the Grove Road path reconstruction will go ahead shortly after several postponements.

(Note- This has been done and looks good—Ed)

Photography Club






Even people who only set foot in church at weddings and funerals will probably know the opening lines of the Lord's Prayer. Part of that prayer is "Thy Kingdom Come" which gives its name to a global prayer movement taking place from 26th May to 5th June. St Andrew's will be joining in with Christians in 172 countries to:

- * deepen our faith
- * pray for 5 friends or family to come to faith in Jesus, and
- * pray for the Holy Spirit to help us witness.

When we pray for God's kingdom to come it isn't about a physical land grab. The physical kingdom of God is not yet. (Despite what some might think, no one knows exactly when it is going to be, which is why we are called to act as if it could be tomorrow.) The new heaven and earth will come on God's timetable.

Aid to Ukraine

I guess I will start by saying a massive thank you to the community of Slip End.

So much effort went in from so many people around the village. It was a warming feeling that so many people cared enough to help out and get involved in any way they could. We ended up collecting lots and lots of medical aid, sanitary and hygiene products. So many nice warm clothes and toys and colouring books to put a smile on some kids' faces. It was all put together by you and I can't thank you enough.

Combined with a friend who lives in Ukraine, we also collected around £7000 in donations so thank you so much to anyone who was able to help with that.

We purchased a 17 seater minibus and filled it with all the aid that was donated.

On the 4th of April, I and a friend of mine, "Mick", set off on the 1300 mile journey to the Ukraine border.

It was a long drive and took three very long days to get there but we arrived on the evening of the 6th of April. *(See photo on the cover!)*

We met with some volunteers and helped where we could but our main goal was to meet with my friend Paul who was to take the aid and minibus right into Ukraine where it could really be of use.

Since dropping the van off, it has taken everything to an aid centre in Lviv *(photo—right)* that Paul is working on. The guys have been running it from there all over Ukraine.

The van has then been all over the country helping people to safety and, just over a week ago, was used to help some evacuees from Chernihiv to Poland, a very



dangerous journey but from the efforts of everyone involved, lives have been saved and many more to follow. *(photo—saving evacuees)*



In total, the small group my friend Paul is working with (MAD foundation) and that we are all part of helping has moved 125 tonnes of vital aid to places it needs to be.

Lots of evacuee missions have been done and now have a combined total of 20 vehicles bringing people to safety every day.

Hundreds of lives are being saved and we will continue to do what we can.

We are in the process of setting up a charity and working on advertising for funding to help grow what we have started.

Myself, Paul, Nadia (Paul's Partner) and Mick will continue to do what we can but aim to get more vehicles, more aid, connect more people with safe places to stay in Europe and get as many people away from dangerous places to safety. There are so many people doing so much good but it all starts from the people who care enough to help in the first place so I thank you all so much for that. You are all amazing people.

Gardening Notes *by Russell Sprout*

I hope you have been able to get out in your gardens on some of the sunny days we have had and are now getting to grips with tidying up of those borders ready for bedding plants, dead heading perennials and any mending of sheds or fences that might have been necessary after the winter.

Daffodils, tulips and hyacinths will need dead heading as they finish flowering and if they need to be removed to make way for other plants replant them very close together out of the way and let them die back gradually.

Dahlias can be planted out from the third week of this month when we should be finished with frosts. Chrysanthemums can go in about the second week in May and stake tall varieties as you plant them. Gladioli need to be kept weed free and a good mulch 2 inches thick will keep the moisture as the plants depend on dampness at the roots to flower well. If you have any alpines trim those which have flowered to prevent seeding and prolong flowering period. Roses will come under attack from aphids and before resorting to chemicals try spraying with soapy water which will also get rid of greenfly but it does have to be done on a regular basis and you should wash it off after about 15/20 minutes, either using a hand held water spray or fine hose. If you really must resort to chemicals then use a systemic insecticide which is absorbed by the plant and into the sap stream killing greenflies that feed on the sap. Check for black spot or mildew and spray if necessary. Remove rolled up leaves containing tortrix caterpillar or sawfly grub and destroy (but don't put them in the compost heap).

A layer of grit or stones in the top of patio pots will reduce the amount of water evaporating and lessen the amount of water required to keep plants healthy. Cut off dead flower heads and thin out weak shoots from shrubs that have finished flowering. Remove dead wood and thin shoots to keep old forsythias shapely. Don't be too eager to get those bedding plants out until nearer the end of the month when the threat of frosts has passed.

Hostas are in leaf now and will need some form of slug protection as they can devastate plants in a very short time. There are several alternatives to slug pellets, you could try crumbled egg shells, the slugs get stuck to them and don't like it, a small bowl containing beer which they drink and then can't get out again, you can also use bran flakes (not the breakfast variety) which again they stick to and will avoid for that reason. If you really must use slug pellets be aware that they can be dangerous to other animals and don't scatter them where dogs or cats may try to eat them.

Lawns will benefit from a light nitrogen feed at this time of year, it comes as liquid or granulated fertilizer and will give your lawn a lush green appearance. Make sure the blades are sharp on your mower and if the weather is dry leave about an inch of growth to stop the lawn from drying out and going brown. If planning a new lawn cultivate now, leave rough for the summer and sow in the autumn.

Keep an eye on the weather and be ready to cover potatoes if frost is forecast. Erect runner bean frames and plant seed from the second week of the month. Marrows, courgettes, squashes and pumpkins can be sown outdoors from the third week of the month. French beans can be sown from the second week, continue sowing lettuce, beetroot and carrots for a fresh supply of tender young vegetables.
