Luton Rising's Expansion Plans for Luton Airport

Current limit: 19 million passengers per annum

2025-27: Expand Terminal 1 to allow 21.5 million passengers

2033-36: Build Terminal 2, aircraft stands, car parks on Wigmore Park

to increase capacity to 27 million passengers

2037-41: Extend Terminal 2 facilities to accommodate 32 million Overall, 50% more flights per day and 70% more at night

National Planning Inspectors recommended refusing permission due to increased noise, environmental impacts, and effect on local roads.

The Secretary of State overturned this and granted permission. LADACAN (Luton And District Association for the Control of Aircraft Noise) has employed lawyers to request a Judicial Review of this decision on behalf of local communities, and the request was granted.

Judicial Review process

This takes place at the High Court in London on 4th and 5th November. The High Court Decision will probably be reserved, so judgement / order will not be known until several months after the hearing.

LADACAN will do a press release for the hearing itself, and then another for the judgment. It will take advice on any appeal (by us or in response to an appeal by them), after that.



Gardening Notes by Russell Sprout

At the time of writing the weather isn't conducive to getting out in the garden to do those tidying up jobs for the winter, hopefully by the time you are reading this it has stopped long enough to get them done. Continue digging as ground becomes vacant and leave for the frosts to break down over the winter. Don't be too zealous, remember that wildlife need somewhere to overwinter and don't forget to check that bonfire for hedgehogs before you light it!

Check chrysanthemums left in the soil for water logging and insert a fork to its full depth to aid drainage. Stools taken in over winter should be kept moist but not wet. Gladioli corms can be cleaned up any time during the winter and discard any that are diseased and try to grow gladioli in a different position each year to stop dry rot, fusarium rot and botrytis. Continue to plant border carnations and pinks during mild spells and complete planting tulips and hyacinths as soon as possible. Check dahlia tubers for drying out and if they appear shrivelled soak them in tepid water for the night. Remove any parts of the tubers that start to rot with a sharp knife and dust them with flowers of sulphur.

Clear up any fallen leaves and add them to the compost heap, or use them to make your own leaf-mould, (but do check that they don't have black spot). Roses planted this month will get off to a good start but only plant them as deep as the old soil mark on the stem. Climbing and rambling roses need to be planted at least fifteen inches away from a wall to prevent lack of water to the roots. Lift tender plants like fuchsias, begonias and geraniums, and bring inside to over-winter if you haven't already done so.

Ventilate the greenhouse on sunny days if you still have tomatoes ripening but close them in the afternoon to help keep in some heat. Alternatively, pick your tomatoes and bring them inside to ripen off. White fly can be a problem at this time of year so fumigate with a HCH smoke or spray to eradicate this problem.

Blackcurrant bushes will require some of the old wood removing but leave as much new growth as possible, treat gooseberries in much the same way. If you are planting fruit trees, then prune back by about two-thirds of the young shoot straight afterwards. Prune blackberries, raspberries and loganberries cutting out all this year's fruiting shoots and tie in new ones and cut out any weak ones.

If you have a pond finish preparing for winter by removing old leaves and thinning oxygenating plants. Leave foliage on marginal reeds and rushes as a protection against severe weather. Protect the pool against falling leaves by covering it with small-mesh netting. Overhaul pumps used for waterfalls and fountains, removing submersible types from the water and storing them in a dry place.

A Message from St Andrew's

November is that month when we are rightly called upon to remember those who have given their lives in time of conflict.

Many of you will know someone who has fought, or been affected, by war. The pictures to the right are of my father (on the right) who fought in Burma, and my father in law engaged in the early days of radar. Both men returned after the war, but my father would never talk about his experiences.



I have one grandson who is in the army, and one granddaughter who is in the Royal Air Force. My wife and I do worry about what might happen should they be called upon to fight for their country.

Today, we try to remember. We remember the victims of wars, wars past and wars on-going, particularly those who died to help bring freedom and to help make the world a better place. But let's also remember with thanks, those who returned from conflict whose contribution to peace was no less important.

Remembrance Sunday is a stark reminder that our world is deeply broken and divided because of human violence. Yet, at the same time Christians believe that this is God's world, and although far from perfect now, there will come that time when God will make all things new for those who follow Jesus.

God calls us to look to Jesus, the Prince of Peace. In the life and teachings of Jesus we see that he does not enter into physical battle in order to defeat the enemies of God. He chooses the way of non-violence. He lays down his life and dies at the hands of God's enemies in order to defeat evil. Only then does God raise Jesus from the dead in the victory over sin and death. In the person of Jesus we see the perfect example of humble obedience, sacrificial love and life-giving peace, an inner peace that can be ours as we turn to him.

So, don't expect that world peace will ever be fully established, in fact, there hasn't been one day in over 200 years without some kind of war on earth. Jesus said, *nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom*, and this will happen until that day when God fully establishes his kingdom.

Our Reader Richard, led some of the service and, along with his wife Marian did the little sketch about 'Beans' that Julie and I had also done for the school children. It was a lovely service and thanks again for all the harvest produce given.


